Hofius / Connolly House Update

Last year, there was much concern from First Hill neighbors about news that the <u>new Archbishop Paul Etienne said that he would not live in the</u> <u>Hofius/Connolly House</u>. Archbishop Etienne also signaled that there were discussions about selling the historic building.

We are happy to announce that the Archdiocese of Seattle plans to preserve the house and use it for Archdiocesan purposes. While long term uses of the building are undetermined, the building appears to be safe in the short-term. We are thrilled about this news and we are grateful to <u>Historic Seattle</u> for tracking this closely.
